Origins of... **Memorial City Mall** and CityCentre



Constructed by MetroNational in the early 1960s, and completed in 1966, Memorial City Mall has grown to be one of Houston's most popular malls. However, it if you've lived in Memorial long enough, you know that when it opened, it was a very middle-market shopping venue, with Sears, Walgreen Drug, Piccadilly Cafeteria and an S.H. Kress variety 5 and 10 store. A single-screen cinema, the Memorial Theater, which opened in June 1962, was also connected with the interior mallway. A Montgomery Ward was added, as a second anchor store, in 1972.

In 2009 CityCentre became the newest addition to Memorial shopping centers. Originally Town & Country Mall, the Midway Companies developed center includes elegant dining, upscale apartments and voguish retail.
